Requirements for Scholarships

Requirements for Applicants:

- Graduating senior in high school who has been accepted into an accredited university/college
 or trade school
- Will be enrolled as a student for the Fall 2026 semester.
- Must be a Camden city resident or attend a Camden school. Proof will be required
- One Reference. Please provide one letter of recommendation. Professional and academic references preferred, but not required. References cannot be friends or family.
- 3.0 or higher GPA
- Applicant must be of Hispanic heritage
- Essay must be 500 words

Deadline

Application must be submitted by March 29, 2026 to jennifer@movitricolor.org with the subject being, "2026 Hispanic Heritage Scholarship Submission." Late applications will not be accepted. The applications will be reviewed by the Scholarship Committee. A formal letter of acceptance will be sent via email to the scholarship winner by April 12, 2026. The recipient is expected to prove enrollment for the Fall 2026 semester before scholarship funds will be provided. The recipient will be expected to attend "College Signing Day" during the first week of May in 2026. At College Signing Day, the recipient will be presented with the scholarship.
